Healthcare Campus in Context

As one of the UK's leading independent healthcare providers, St Andrew's Healthcare appointed Oxford Architects to design and deliver a flagship building on their historic Northampton campus, working alongside the façade architect.

Set in historic parkland, the 19,650sqm 4-storey building neo-classical building design responds to the client's aspirations and its context within the campus. Accommodating up to 132 patients across 8 wards, all patients are provided with single bedrooms complete with en-suite facilities. The self-contained wards provide a mixture of dayrooms, a dining room, therapy rooms, seclusion/ de-escalation facilities, a nurse base along with ancillary accommodation and an external courtyard. The central reception leads to child visits, tribunal and various support and therapy facilities that includes amongst others-workshops, library, swimming pool, multi-faith room, hairdresser, medical suite, property stores, and a caf  teria.

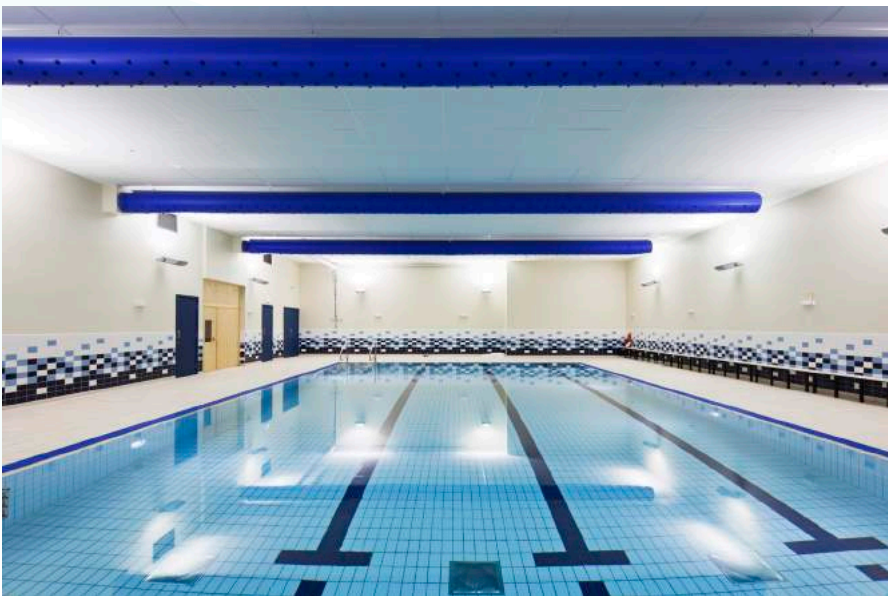
